Weaknesses

1. Active membership tends to decline after a students' freshman year.
2. Our chapter is lacking a wide class of active sophomores and freshmen.
3. As a chapter we need to plan and execute high-quality meetings that will keep members engaged.
4. We need to improve above chapter participation by offering reduced costs for conferences.
5. We need to motivate members to have a positive attitude about FFA.
6. We need to encourage more Livingston High School faculty to support our chapter and AG education.

Threats

1. Community and Livingston High School's faculty negative perception and biases towards agriculture.
2. Chapter members stretched too thin from various extracurricular activities such as sports and clubs.
3. Increase in other non-AG related CTE classes across campus that take students away from our program.
4. Decrease in the ability to successfully retain membership from freshman and sophomore classes.
5. Lack of knowledge and promotional material regarding opportunities within FFA and SAEs.
6. Lack of participation from chapter members in fundraisers.

Outcomes

1. Increase member involvement from 45% to 50% during the 22-23 year by offering additional activities.
2. Increase community and school support by establishing the Livingston FFA Ag Boosters.
3. Offer one new agriculture class for the 2022-2023 school year.
4. Improve school farm maintenance and remodeling during the 2022-2023 school year.
5. Increase LDE involvement by 8 members by informing students of the benefits during the 22-23 year.
6. Increase the time our leadership team devotes to activities during the week by one hour.
